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Burnaby Velodrome Fact Sheet

Description: A 200m long, 6m wide wooden velodrome, one of only 3 indoor velodromes in North America. Operated by the Burnaby Velodrome Club, a registered non-profit organization supporting competitive cycling, youth athlete development, and adult wellness activities in Greater Vancouver.

Objective: To provide athletes of all abilities a safe, challenging environment in which to race and train. To provide programs for novice, junior, women, and fitness enthusiasts to pursue their own athletic goals.

History: Constructed between 1992 and 1997. Opened doors in 1997 as the first indoor velodrome in North America.
